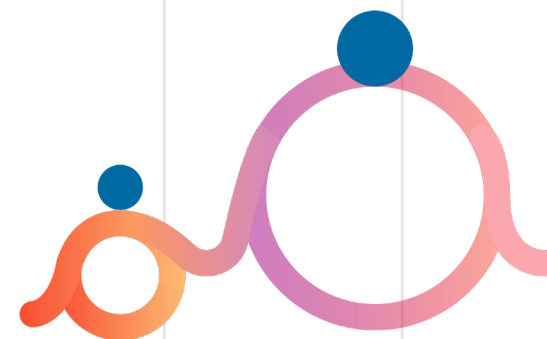

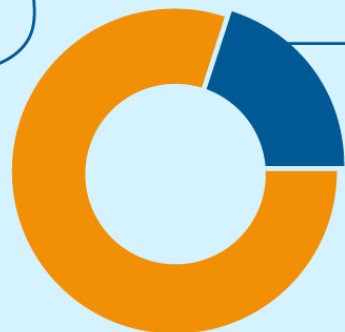

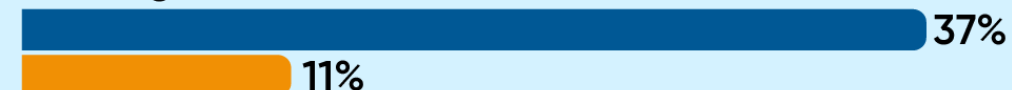


Compared to 2020, the participation of fathers in caring for a child under 3 years old significantly increased:

buying goods for children



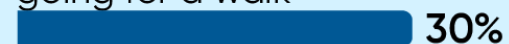

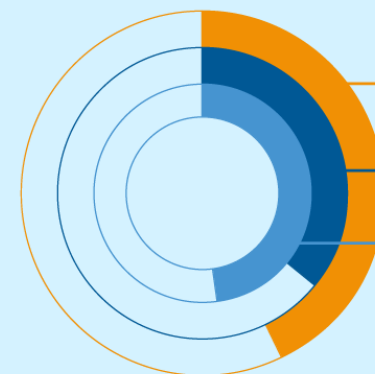

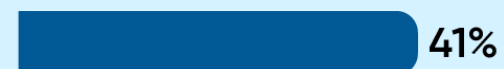


A relative majority of parents who have increased time spent with their children as a result of the war, explain this by:

poor psychological condition of children



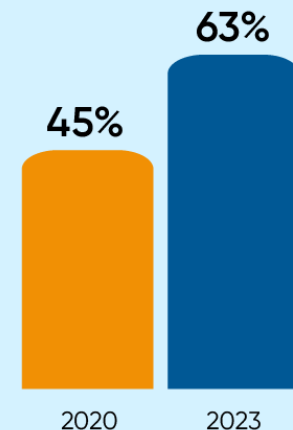

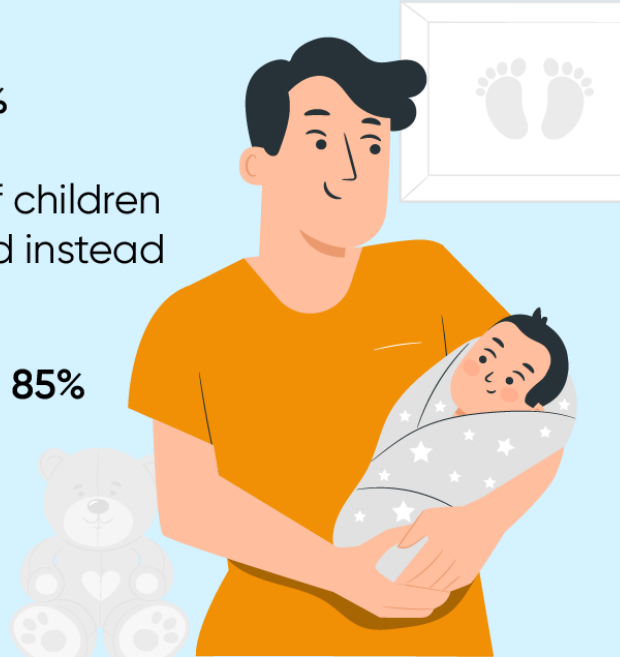


The majority of parents know that the child's father has a legal right to take:

a leave to take care of children aged under 3 years old instead of the child's mother



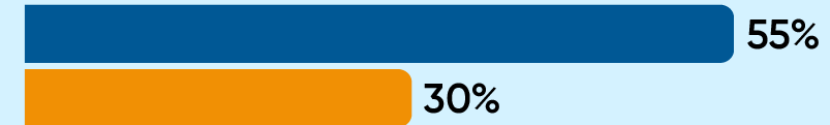

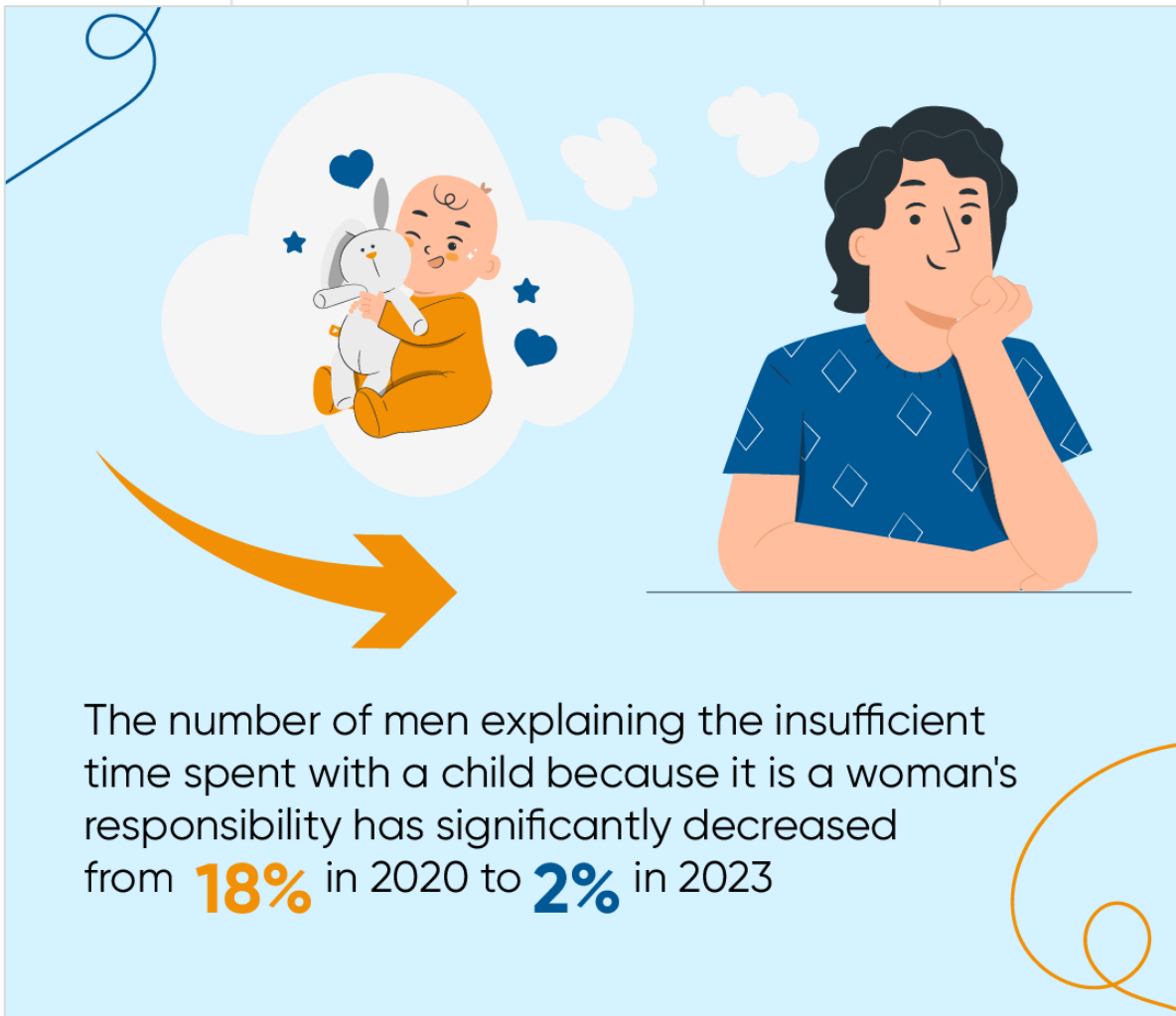
