
The influence of full-scale war on the choice of profession



53% of Ukrainians believe that the division into "female" and "male" professions is due to physiological differences between women and men – at the same time, in 2021, there were 73%

 44% of Ukrainians don't agree that there are professions that are suitable only for men and only for women. This indicator has significantly increased since 2021, when it was 30%




50% of Ukrainians believe that it's gender stereotypes that are the cause of misconceptions about specifically "male" or "female" professions, and not gender itself


