


ADDRESSING GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE AND MENTAL TRAUMA

- ◆ Three Survivor Relief Centres operate in Zaporizhzhia, Lviv and Dnipro to provide psychological, social, legal and informational support to internally displaced people and survivors of gender-based violence. These centres have helped 1,186 people since they opened between July and August 2022.
- ◆ UNFPA continues to coordinate with 27 facilities for GBV survivors, including shelters, crisis rooms and daycare centres, the national hotline and 101 psychosocial support (PSS) mobile teams. These services provide psychological and social assistance to GBV and domestic violence survivors. During the reporting period, there have been 2,335 calls and online requests to the hotline and the PSS mobile teams provided 652 individual consultations.
- ◆ Four service delivery points in Kryvyi Rih, Vinnytsia, Mykolaiv and Odesa provide medical and informational assistance for GBV and conflict-related sexual violence (CRSV) survivors.

ENSURING SAFE BIRTH, REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

- ◆ To fill the critical gap in medical supplies and equipment, 81 metric tonnes of inter-agency reproductive health kits have been delivered to hospitals with perinatal centres in 22 regions since the start of the war.
- ◆ In the last two weeks, over 750 people in Kyiv, Vinnytsia and Lviv received medical services and referrals at three UNFPA-supported reproductive health mobile teams in the last two weeks. In the coming months, UNFPA will open an additional 28 reproductive health mobile teams and 2 mobile clinics to meet the increasing need for medical assistance for both internally displaced people and the local population.
- ◆ Under the SRH working group interventions, UNFPA mapped previously trained providers and shared this information with the SRH WG. To reduce duplication going forward, the SRH WG database will be updated with information about the training conducted by other partners. The database will be used in the referral pathways for survivors.

UNFPA UKRAINE FUNDING STATUS (AS OF 28 AUGUST)

- ◆ In March 2022, UNFPA launched its emergency appeal of **\$47.75 million for life-saving reproductive health and gender-based violence interventions** to address the needs of women and girls in Ukraine. There is an urgent requirement for sexual and reproductive health services and more funding is needed.
- ◆ By 28 August, the UNFPA Appeal for Ukraine was 80 per cent funded thanks to **USAID's Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (BHA), Denmark, the Republic of Korea, Canada, the United Kingdom, Sweden, Estonia, Spain, Norway, Iceland, Ireland, Australia, the EU (DG-ECHO, DG-NEAR), Ukraine Humanitarian Fund (UHF), the UN Partnership to Promote the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNPRPD) and CERF.**
- ◆ UNFPA is also grateful to our donors for contributing to the essential core resources that ensure programmes are delivered in a predictable and sustainable manner.
