⇒ INTER-AGENCY COORDINATION

GBV Sub-Cluster (GBV SC)

- In December 2022, GBViE humanitarian coordination meetings were held jointly with the GBV SC and the regional authorities in Lviv, Ternopil, Sumy, Kherson, Kyiv and Odesa. Currently, there are 16 GBViE regional coordination working groups operating in the regions of Rivne, Volyn, Dnipropetrovsk, Chernihiv, Vinnytsia, Kherson, Ivano-Frankivsk, Cherkasy, Odesa, Zhytomyr, Chernivtsi, Zakarpattia, Lviv, Ternopil, Sumy and Kyiv.
- On 8 December, the GBV SC in Ukraine—together with the Inter-Agency Working Group on Male Survivors of Sexual Violence—held a thematic meeting to discuss the needs of male survivors in Ukraine and how to ensure GBV services are accessible to all survivors, including men and boys. A dedicated working group under the GBV SC will start work in January to contextualize new global guidelines on the needs of male survivors of sexual violence in the Ukrainian context.

SRH Technical Working Group (SRMCH TWG)

- In December, the SRH TWG shared the initial mapping of the clinical management of rape (CMR) and training with SRH partners. In January, a CMR coordination sub-working group will hold a meeting. A public online platform is being planned, supported by iMMAP, in order to share resources, mapping, assessments, meeting information and announcements.
- The SRH TWG will nominate a national co-chair to support coordination. The humanitarian response plan for SRH activities in 2023 will be shared in January.

LATEST NEWS FROM UNFPA IN UKRAINE:

- More than 1 million people in 60 cities and communities throughout Ukraine took part in UNFPA activities during the 16 days of activism against GBV (from November 25 to December 10). <u>Watch</u> this video to find out more.
- In December, Break the Circle—the largest GBV-related campaign for women and girls in Ukraine—was relaunched. Together with Maria Efrosynina, UNFPA Honorary Ambassador in Ukraine, UNFPA released a video to begin a wave of activities encouraging women to break the silence whenever they experience violence. <u>Watch the video</u>.
- To support women and girls from the most vulnerable groups in Ukraine, UNFPA and the European Union published a series of inspirational stories about successful women with disabilities including an Olympic medalist, an athlete, a local activist and an entrepreneur. <u>Watch their stories</u>.

UNFPA UKRAINE FUNDING STATUS (AS OF 15 DECEMBER)

- In March 2022, UNFPA launched its emergency appeal. To align with the revised United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) appeal and based on continuing needs, as of October UNFPA Ukraine has decided to increase its funding requirement to US\$57.75 million for life-saving reproductive health and gender-based violence interventions to address the needs of women and girls in Ukraine. There is an urgent requirement for sexual and reproductive health services and more funding is needed.
- As of 15 December, the UNFPA Appeal for Ukraine was 70 per cent funded thanks to USAID's Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (BHA), Australia, the United Kingdom, Denmark, CERF, Canada, Spain, Netherlands, the EU (DG-ECHO, DG-NEAR), Norway, Ireland, OCHA-Ukraine Humanitarian Fund, Sweden, Iceland, Estonia and the UN Partnership to Promote the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNPRPD).
- UNFPA is also grateful to our donors for contributing to the essential core resources that ensure programmes are delivered in a predictable and sustainable manner.
