The UN Population Fund in Ukraine works in the following areas:



creating conditions in which every young person can fulfil the potential, lead a healthy lifestyle, know their reproductive rights and take an active social life:



conducting sexual and reproductive health campaigns to improve access to health and care services and improve its quality, especially for young people;



combating gender stereotypes in society (through the media, compulsory education for civil servants on gender mainstreaming, the improvement of national gender policy and anti-discrimination expertise of school textbooks);



providing information and services to gender-based violence survivors through the creation of crisis centres, supporting the work of psychosocial support mobile teams, providing expert support and raising general awareness in society.

# GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE RESPONSE AND PREVENTION PROGRAMME

has been working since 2015 to create a national system for combating and preventing domestic and gender-based violence in Ukraine, and contains the following:



supporting the development of the regulatory framework;



expanding the network of high-quality specialized services for survivors (hotline, shelters, day centres, crisis rooms, emergency healthcare stations, psychosocial support mobile teams, police crews to respond to domestic violence incidents);



promoting inter-agency interaction;



raising awareness and changing public attitudes to the problem of violence.

After February 24, 2022, the day of the full-scale invasion of Ukraine by the Russian Federation, and in response to the unprecedented humanitarian crisis that the war caused, UNFPA Ukraine, among other things, acting within the framework of the Gender-Based Violence Response and Prevention Programme and in partnership with local bodies of power, created a network of specialized centres to respond to, and prevent gender-based violence.

<sup>1</sup> In the conditions of martial law, UNFPA in Ukraine also focuses on providing women's first aid kits, obstetric emergency supplies, post-rape emergency response kits, and contraceptives to areas with a dire need for those, and also continues to implement projects for youth.





# PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT MOBILE TEAMS

Mobile teams provide free social and psychological assistance to people regardless of their gender and status of their stay in communities, i.e. both to residents of local communities and internally displaced persons.

#### WHAT DO MOBILE TEAMS DO?

- Provide psychological assistance to survivors;
- Respond to reports of violence, in particular by way of crisis and emergency intervention;
- Inform survivors about healthcare, legal and other services that
  are available for them to overcome the consequences of violence,
  as well as about providers of those services, in particular about
  general or specialised support services for survivors (shelters, crisis
  rooms, day centres, etc.);
- Explain to the affected persons their rights and opportunities to find assistance;
- Do information-sharing and educational work.

#### **EACH MOBILE TEAM INCLUDES:**

- two specialists (a psychologist and a social worker);
- vehicle driver.

The mobile teams are highly advantageous dur to their flexibility, allowing them to quickly respond to survivors' requests, identify cases

of violence in a timely manner and refer them to the relevant services if necessary. Currently there are 100 mobile teams providing support across 21 oblasts of Ukraine.

Telephone consultations are offered every day from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Counselling for survivors is conducted by individual appointment (appointment time needs to be confirmed with mobile team personnel by telephone).

# **SURVIVOR RELIEF CENTRES**

are state institutions established by the Ukrainian Government in partnership with UNFPA, that provide comprehensive psychosocial support to individuals who have been impacted by war.

#### WHAT SERVICES ARE OFFERED AT THE CENTRES?

- primary psychological counselling to normalise the psychoemotional state;
- consultations by social workers regarding the rights and available support for IDPs (humanitarian aid, information on IDP support centres for accommodation, housing, etc.);
- free consultations by lawyers.

#### IN CASE A VIOLENCE INCIDENT IS DETECTED:

- specialized psychosocial counselling (in cooperation with the mobile team of psychosocial support to survivors of violence);
- case management, in which a specialist of the centre, in accordance with the survivor's needs, connects them with the relevant service providers (for example, refers them to healthcare or legal assistance, places them in a shelter for survivors of violence, etc.). The specialist independently contacts all relevant service providers and accompanies the survivor throughout the relief.




#### **EACH CENTRE EMPLOYS:**

- social workers;
- psychologists, including child psychologists and psychologists to provide specialized psychosocial support to survivors of violence;
- lawyers;
- case managers to provide comprehensive specialized care in cases of war-related violence and ensure that survivors have access to the support they need.

#### SUPPORT IS PROVIDED:

- in a safe manner (in secure and comfortable conditions);
- confidentially (the centre client's identity is not disclosed without the client's informed consent);
- free of charge (the client does not have to pay for any type of assistance, consultation, etc.);
- unconditionally (the client does not have to provide evidence that they have been abused in order to receive support).

## THE AURORA ONLINE PLATFORM

offers specialized support to individuals who have survived violence, including conflict-related sexual violence. This service provides remote assistance across all of Ukraine, including temporarily occupied territories, as well as abroad.

#### THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE AURORA ONLINE PLATFORM:

- psychotherapy of traumatic experience;
- restoration of emotional balance and internal resources to rebuild one's life:
- solutions for health preservation, in particular reproductive health;
- legal consultations;
- placement of survivors in shelters.

#### WHO CAN HAVE ACCESS TO THOSE SERVICES?

- persons who experienced sexual violence and need psychotherapeutic support;
- persons who have legal issues;
- persons who need consultation of a healthcare specialist;
- persons who look for information about possibilities to find shelter.

#### WHO PROVIDES THOSE SERVICES:

psychotherapists; doctors/nurses; lawyers.

#### **COUNSELLING IS PROVIDED:**

- confidentially;
- anonymously;
- free of charge;
- online or by phone at a pre-arranged time convenient for the survivors;
- in compliance with high professional ethical standards.

Any person, regardless of their gender and age, can ask for support: women, girls, men and boys who have experienced violence.

Users of the platform can choose a specialist who will provide longterm support and management of their case.





# **"VONA HUBS"**

are designed to empower women who have experienced, or are at risk, of domestic or gender-based violence, by providing them with career support and financial literacy tips.

#### THE "VONA HUB" OFFERS, FREE OF CHARGE:

- individual confidential consultation by a career consultant;
- help from career consultants at all stages of a job search or starting one's own business:
- support of psychologists;
- opportunities to take professional courses to gain new knowledge, skills or even a profession.

In addition, VONA hubs work in close collaboration with social services, employment centres and businesses to provide a comprehensive range of support services to clients. They also work to transfer knowledge to local partners, thereby ensuring the sustainability of the initiative.

# A MOBILE APPLICATION

# FOR WOMEN WHO SUFFERED FROM, OR ARE AT RISK OF DOMESTIC OR GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

This app is designed to be completely invisible to the abuser and appears as a typical app on the user's phone. This ensures that women can use the app without fear of raising suspicion or putting themselves in danger.

App's hidden interface includes a call button for emergency services SOS that connects directly to the police. This eliminates the need to call the emergency number 102, and the survivor's location is automatically established through geolocation or the address provided at registration.

# IN ADDITION TO THE EMERGENCY CALL FEATURE, THE APP PROVIDES A RANGE OF OTHER RESOURCES AND SUPPORT TOOLS:

- information about signs of violence;
- means to check one's relationships;
- action plan for survivors and witnesses;
- a map and contact information of other aid services.

# "NO TRIVIA"

is a platform that aims to address the emotional and psychological challenges that teenagers face when relocating to a new country. The project initially started on Instragram but has now expended to include a website and a chatbot that offer support and resources to help young people understand and manage their experiences.

The chatbot is a useful tool that allows teenagers to pre-check their emotional state and receive guidance on how to deal with their concenrs. It provides free and anonymour text chat sessions with qualified psychologists, as well as relaxation exercices to help calm their thoughts.

The project also hosts regular live broadcasts with psychologists on Instragram, where teenagers can learn more about issues that concern them. The website contains informative guide cards that explore important issues related to mental health in a simple and interesting way.

# 116 123 NATIONAL HOTLINE

One way to quickly get qualified help for survivors of gender-based or domestic violence is to contact a hotline.

The National Domestic Violence Hotline is a 24-hour, anonymous and confidential hotline that provides informational, legal, psychological and social counselling to survivors of domestic and gender-based violence.

#### **OPERATORS ADVISE:**

- how to act if a person is a survivor of domestic violence or a witness to it:
- help develop an action plan for a specific case of an injured person;
- provide information on what assistance the injured person can receive at the place of residence.

# **HOTLINE FOR MEN**

Maintaining good mental health is crucial for everyone's well-being, but social stigmas and gender stereotypes often discourage men from seeking psychological support. However, now men in Ukraine can access professional psychological counselling and support by calling the short number 2345\* (or for Kyivstar users: +38 067 752 23 45) and receiving help over the phone.

Men can call the hotline for any issue that is causing them stress, such as problems at work, relationship issues, worries caused by war, and difficulties with anger management. By calling, men can receive the necessary support to stabilize their emotional state and overcome their challenged.
